Mayor's Message

I am happy to report that our parks will be fully open by the end of this week—that includes the playgrounds and restrooms. The City will be cleaning the restrooms frequently but the playgrounds will NOT be sanitized. Please maintain a 6-foot distance from others at the parks, and enjoy the great outdoors!

We have just selected a contractor for the Canyon Meadows Wetlands Restoration Project! Finally! We are happy to report that the bid came in \$20,000 under what we had budgeted for the project. This contractor will remove the extra fill from the perimeter of the park, plant wetland vegetation, and place temporary fences around the areas to protect the new growth. Please be mindful of the project and do your best to leave these fragile areas alone. In addition to the restoration and the dog park and trail going in next to the Posse Grounds, we are looking forward to a new full-size ball diamond at Cherry Farms Park as well as pickleball courts at Canyon Meadows Park to come next Spring.

Our water sources have been determined to be from ground water and surface water sources.

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for South Weber Water System is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources and management strategies to protect our drinking water. Our sources have been determined to have a low level of susceptibility from potential contamination.

## Voting & COVID-19

The State Legislature passed HB3006 during a special session on April 22, 2020. This bill made substantial changes to how the Primary Election is administered.

- No Early Voting
- No In-Person Voter Registration
- No Election Day Voter Registration
- Limited Election Day Voting
- Ballots may only be sent to voters affiliated with a participating party or to unaffiliated voters who qualify and have requested a ballot.

Davis County is committed to making this election as accessible and open as possible under these new requirements.

- Unaffiliated Voters will receive a questionnaire to request a ballot
- Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters 3 weeks before the election
- Return Postage will be paid
- Ballot drop boxes will be available at all City Offices through June 29th
- A single drive-thru polling location will be centrally located in the County and will be open on Election Day from 7 am—8 pm.

Ballots will be mailed beginning June 9, 2020 and must be postmarked by June 30th.
