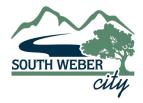

**Paul Sturm of South Weber City** commented on Cooper's Landing Development Concept with concern this would be the first true Flex/Commercial development in the city and urged the City Council and Planning Commission to proceed cautiously.

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**Michael Grant of South Weber City** voiced concern with recent legislation in which new developments are to be reviewed by the Planning Commission and no longer City Council. He queried when the City's General Plan will be reviewed.

# **PRESENTATIONS**

# 4. Davis County Animal Care Update

Animal Care Director Ashleigh Young expressed Animal Care of Davis County is committed to promoting responsible pet ownership and compassionate animal care by fulfilling three goals: 1) serve and educate our community, 2) find homes for our homeless pets, and 3) support public safety. The facility is open Monday – Friday 10 am–6 pm and Saturday 12 pm–4 pm. The facility provides public services such as vaccination clinics and spay/neuter. She announced the RFP will be submitted soon for an architect and a construction company for the new facility which will remain on the same land as the current facility with the current facility remining in operation throughout construction. She announced they are currently doing free micro-chipping. They also have a rigorous volunteer program.

# 5. Cooper's Landing Development Concept

Developer Blair Gardner explained he is currently looking to purchase property at 6500 South 475 East. He acknowledged there is no current city code for commercial/flex development. He presented drawings of similar projects and related the business condominiums are sold and will include a Commercial Owner's Association (COA). He announced parking will limit which type of businesses would be possible and noted each would have to go through the approval process. The intention is to limit traffic. There is a stop waste system possible that has been used in other developments tracking any wrongful discharge into the waste system. All units will have security cameras. There are two different ingress/egress for traffic flow. Councilman Halverson added there are a several easements in this area which make development difficult. Discussion took place regarding the aesthetics as this is an entrance to the city. Councilwoman Petty affirmed she is open to this concept. Mayor Westbroek agreed. Councilman Dills considered this to be a good project and would like to see more retail. Councilman Davis is open to discussion on this type of project. Councilman Winsor is concerned with the number of units and the amount of space, but he is willing to entertain this concept.

# Mayor Westbroek welcomed newly hired Community Services Director Lance Evans.

# 7. Ordinance 2024-02: Title 1 Chapter 2 Section 5 (E)(1) Amendment

One location in the City Code still requires the posting of ordinances (or summaries) in the newspaper. That has not been the practice for several years and is not required by the state. The alternative is to post in 3 public places within the city. That has been accomplished through the city and state websites and at City Hall, but that is not clearly delineated as acceptable in our code. This section should be aligned with all the others, removing the newspaper as it is a nearly obsolete method of transmitting City information.

Councilman Dills moved to approve Ordinance 2024-02: Title 1 Chapter 2 Section 5 (E) (1) Amendment. Councilman Halverson seconded the motion. Mayor Westbroek called for a roll call vote. Council Members Davis, Dills, Halverson, Petty, and Winsor voted aye. The motion carried.

# 8. Water and Sewer Utility Rate Studies Contract

South Weber City sought proposals for an experienced consultant or team of consultants to complete both a Culinary Water and a Sewer Rate Study. Only one Proposal was received – Zions Public Finance Inc. (ZPFI). The study and final report will evaluate the City's current rates in relationship to the City's ability to fund the overall operation, maintenance, and capital projects of each utility over the next 10 years. Each rate study will include an analysis to determine the projected rate(s) for the next 10 years based on (1) the rate remaining the same as current; and (2) the rate covers operations, system replacement & facilities maintenance, and capital project costs.

Councilwoman Petty moved to award the water and sewer utility rate studies contract to Zions Public Finance Inc. (ZPFI) for \$11,000. Councilman Dills seconded the motion. Mayor Westbroek called for a roll call vote. Council Members Davis, Dills, Halverson, Petty, and Winsor voted aye. The motion carried.

# **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

# 9. Legislative Review

City Manager David Larson reported on various bills.

Utah Leagues of Cities and Towns (ULCT) strongly opposes:

SB172 (Protection Areas Revisions),

HB502 (Critical Infrastructure and Mining).

He discussed putting a visual together of the nuisance and effect on quality of life that gravel pits have on a community. Councilman Winsor related how the dust effects water quality as it goes into city storm drains.

<u>ULCT opposes:</u> **HB289** (Property Rights Ombudsman Amendments) **SB185** (Residential Building Inspections Amendments) **HB 489** which permits party affiliation to appear on the ballot next to the name of certain nonpartisan candidates.

<u>ULCT supports</u>:

HB465 (Housing Affordability Revisions).

He also mentioned **SB268** First Home Investment Zone Act is being developed and allows municipalities to create a first home investment zone.

# **TRAINING**

# 10. Open & Public Meetings Act (OPMA), Powers and Duties Review, Ethics Review

City Attorney Jayme Blakesley outlined the requirements for annual training on State and City code related to OPMA, powers & duties, and ethics for the Mayor and City Council. Meetings must be open unless lawfully closed, with a quorum necessitating an open meeting. Public meetings require 24 hours' notice, agenda, and recorded minutes, and electronic meetings are permitted. No ordinance or resolution may be adopted except in an open meeting. Exceptions include certain matters like salary schedules, tax levies, budgets, and land use regulations. Closed meetings require a quorum and must meet specific subject matter requirements, announced publicly. He reminded the City Council it is in their best interest to not conduct any city business during a chance meeting or social gathering.

Mr. Blakesley also discussed the roles under Utah's Land Use, Development, and Management Act (LUDMA, designating the Legislative Body (City Council) as responsible for enacting land use regulations. The Land Use Authority (City Council, Planning Commission, or City Staff) applies land use regulations, favoring land use applications in the absence of restrictions. The Appeal Authority handles variances and appeals from land use decisions.

Furthermore, Mr. Blakesley explained the Municipal Officers' and Employees' Ethics Act, which establishes standards of conduct, requires disclosure of conflicts of interest, and prohibits improper conduct such as misuse of office for personal gain. Written and oral disclosures are required for various situations, with penalties including criminal charges and dismissal from employment or office.

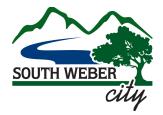

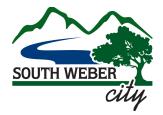

In October of 2022 an F-35 crashed in South Weber. The toxic gases put off by the burning aircraft made it necessary to dispose of the turnouts that were used on the fire. We also rotate our turnouts every 10 years per NFPA 1851. NFPA 1851 is the standard that establishes requirements for the selection, care, and maintenance of structural firefighting protective clothing and equipment, dictates gear that is 10 years past its manufacture date should be retired. We have multiple turnouts that are reaching the 10 year limit that need to be replaced and we are trying to spread that over several budget years but the F-35 crash created a need to replace more turnouts sooner.

## **ORDINANCE 2024-03**

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE SOUTH WEBER CITY COUNCIL RESTRICTING THE **USE OF PERSONAL FIREWORKS WITHIN CERTAIN PORTIONS OF THE CITY**

WHEREAS, Fire Chief Tolman has reviewed conditions within the city and finds significant brush, grass, and tree covered areas which create dangerous fire hazard conditions and recommends repeating restrictions from last year prohibiting personal fireworks to be discharged within the city which would greatly reduce risk; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the minimal public inconvenience is significantly outweighed by the need to protect the public health and safety of the entire population;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of South Weber City, State of Utah:

Section 1. Restriction: Pursuant to the provision of the Utah Code Ann. 15A-5-202.5 and based on the findings as noted above, the use of personal fireworks is hereby restricted in all areas of the City indicated on **Exhibit A**, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. This restriction shall remain in effect until October 15, 2024, unless terminated through action of the City Council. This restriction shall not apply to permitted public fireworks displays authorized by the City and approved by the City's fire code official.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, part, or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance, and all sections, parts and provision of this Ordinance shall be severable.

Section 3. General Repealer. Ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date. For the protection and preservation of public health and safety, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage. The City Recorder is hereby directed to publish and/or post this Ordinance forthwith.

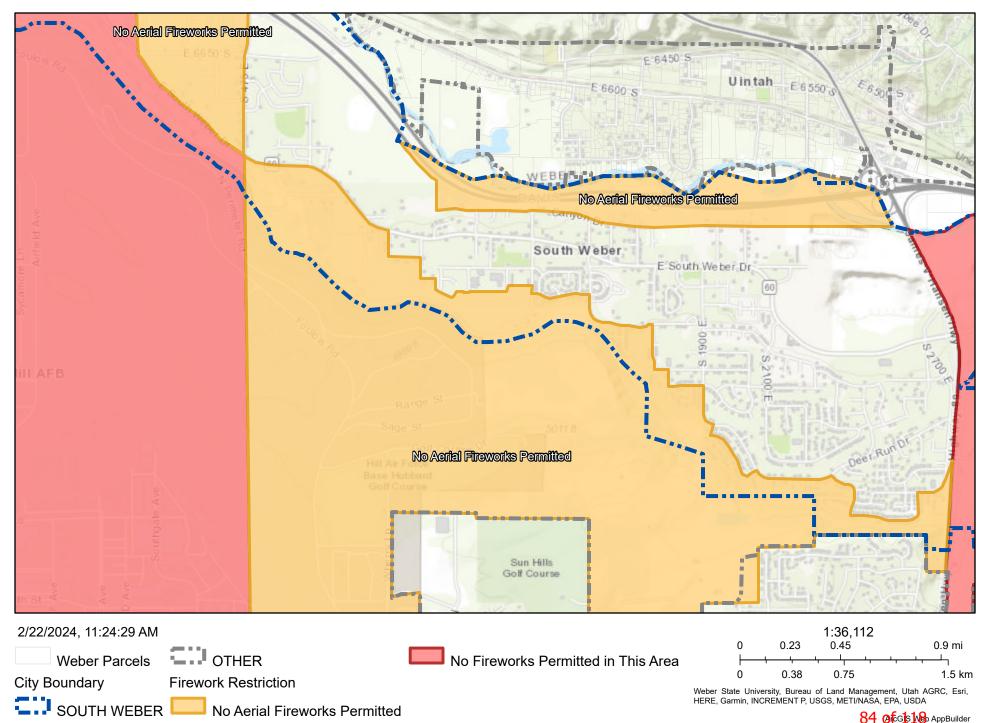

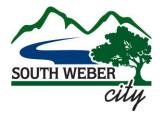

#### <u>PURPOSE</u>

To vacate a portion of Lester Street, which now lies outside of the new Lester Street Right-of-Way (ROW) alignment, to the previous property owner(s).

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the council approve the attached ordinance for the vacation of a portion of the Lester Street ROW.

## VACATION CODE REQUIREMENTS

Per City Code, Section 11-12-2: VACATING A STREET, RIGHT OF WAY, OR EASEMENT, vacations shall be done in accordance with Utah Code Annotated 10-9a-609.5 or its successor statute and the Administrative Land Use Authority shall be the City Council. State Code requires that an ordinance be adopted vacating the public street with a legal description of the public street to be vacated. A public hearing must be held and the ordinance must be recorded at the County Recorder's office.

## BACKGROUND

The General Plan shows a connection between the west end of Lester Street and the east end of 7375 South. The city has been diligently working towards making this connection to improve the safety and accessibility of this area, especially as it relates to providing two means of ingress and egress to South Weber Elementary.

Layne Kap proposed a new development in this area wherein this street connection could be made. A Development Agreement between Layne and the city was negotiated and approved (dated 9/26/2023, and recorded on 10/5/2023 as Entry #3546468), which outlines the requirements of both parties. One of the items that the city agreed to was the vacation of the portion of the Lester Street ROW described in the ordinance.

## ANALYSIS

The realignment of Lester Street includes a new stub street in a location that continues to provide access and development opportunity for the property owners to which the previous Lester Street stub was located. Therefore, there is no need to continue to maintain the portion of public ROW that is proposed to be vacated. A municipal utility easement will remain in place over the vacated property to provide for utilities that remain in the property.

## ORDINANCE 2024-04

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE SOUTH WEBER CITY COUNCIL VACATING A PORTION OF THE LESTER STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY

**WHEREAS,** the portion of Lester Street that is located west of 1075 East was platted, constructed, and stubbed for access to future development; and

**WHEREAS**, the City's General Plan shows the need to connect Lester Street to 7375 South, which reconfiguration leaves a portion of Lester Street outside of the new street alignment; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has reviewed and determined that there is no current or future need for this portion of Lester Street to remain as public right-of-way; and

**WHEREAS**, the City, through the Development Agreement for Kastlecove Phase 1 (recorded as Entry #3546468), agreed to the vacation of the said portion of Lester Street; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed street vacation set forth herein has been reviewed by the City Council and a public hearing has been held in accordance with Utah law to obtain public input regarding the proposed public interest in the section of the street.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF SOUTH WEBER CITY, STATE OF UTAH:

**Section 1. Findings:** The City Council finds that neither the public interest nor any person will be materially injured by the vacation and there is good cause for the vacation.

**Section 2. Street Vacation:** The following description of a portion of the Lester Street right-ofway, no longer serves a public purpose and is hereby vacated as a public right-of-way:

## See Exhibit "A" and "B"

The vacated right-of-way shall be conveyed back to the previous owner(s) of the property. Said owners being Kastle Rock Excavation & Development, LLC (Layne Kap), Calvin Kap, and Keith Kap, with each having an equal and proportionate share.

<u>Section 3. Reservation of Easements:</u> South Weber City, for and on behalf of itself and all public utilities providing service within South Weber City, hereby reserves a permanent and perpetual municipal utility easement occupying the entire parcel being vacated, as shown in **Exhibit "B**."

<u>Section 4. Severability Clause:</u> If any part or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance and all provisions, clauses and words of this Ordinance shall be severable.

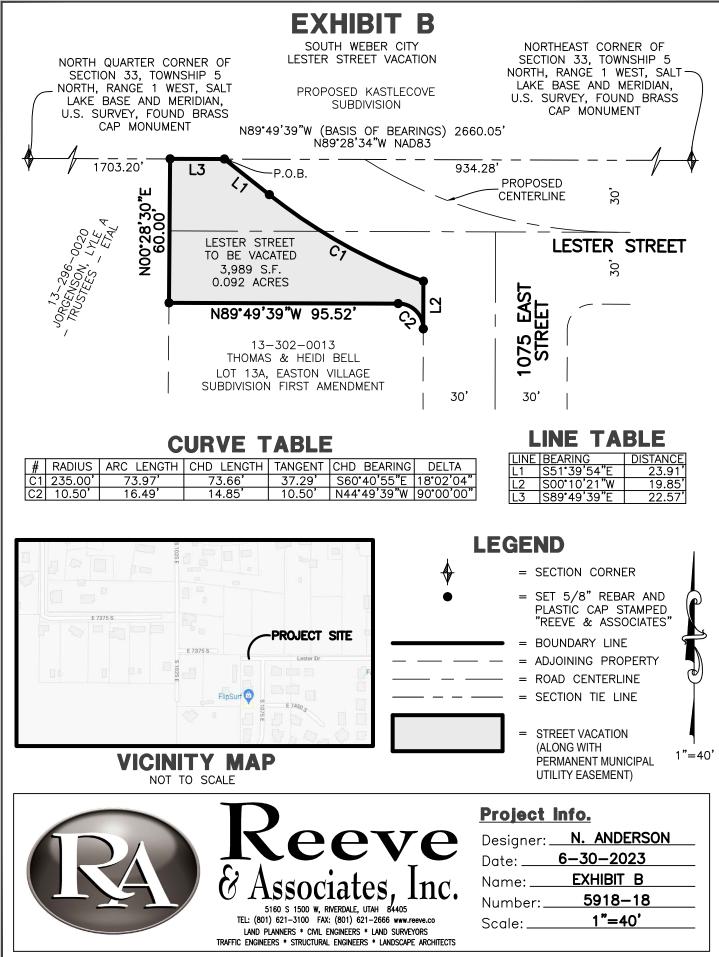

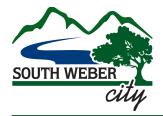

#### 6. Review and Action CUP Public Works Site

Mr. Jones answered the question regarding the RV site which will be located north of the public works site. He mentioned the site plan has not been approved yet but the plan for their access is from South Weber Drive and through the public works' site. There will be a gate on the north property line between the two parcels. Commissioner Losee asked for details on Kingston Drive. It will be paved and 26-feet across with a locked swing gate. Commissioner Roberts asked if the RV company can choose to use Kingston. Commissioner Losee reminded the Planning Commission that the project will come forward later and primary access can be addressed then. This meeting is solely for the Public Works site. The entrance from South Weber Drive will also be 26-feet and have two lanes. There will not be a turning lane. It is not required by UDOT though it is a possibility in the future. Commissioner McFadden asked about traffic study results. Mr. Jones replied that a trip generation was done and provided in the staff report in the packet. Commissioner McFadden then inquired about mitigating any detriment to the nearby residents. Mr. Jones stated that the buildings were placed in the center of the lot as far from the homes as possible. Masonry fence also provides screening, and the lighting will be dark sky compliant. There will be impact but the city has tried to minimize it as much as possible. Commissioner Skola asked if the requested fencing variance will significantly increase the noise. Several Commissioners indicated the air force jets from Hill Airforce Base will create much more noise. The Commission was concerned with the bare ground and how it will be utilized and possible dumping or unsightly appearance. Fencing continued to cause confusion, so Mr. Jones highlighted on the map the various existing and proposed fencing and delineated which will be masonry and which chain link. Commissioner Losee asked about the expanded basin and if Harper Way will be extended. Mr. Jones

assured the basin is part of the project and Nilson Homes will be completing Harper Way as already approved in the Riverwood Subdivision. Commissioner Boatwright mused whether the city would have added a second entrance if it were not required. He strongly suggested a review of the open land area in case it begins to get unsightly.

Commissioner McFadden moved to recommend to City Council approval of the conditional use permit for the public works site with the following conditions.

# 13 Waterline CITY COUNCIL MEETING STAFF REPORT

## AGENDA ITEM

Waterline Improvement Agreement (1375 East Waterline Project, Kastlecove 2 portion)

#### PURPOSE

To put in place an agreement for the construction of and payment for a portion of the 1375 East Waterline Project that is located within the Kastlecove Phase 2 Subdivision.

## RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the council approve the attached Waterline Improvement Agreement and associated payment amount of \$30,335 to Kastlerock Excavation & Development LLC (Layne Kap).

## BACKGROUND

The current fiscal year budget includes funding for a waterline replacement and upgrade project, titled 1375 East Waterline Project. The scope of this project is to replace the waterline south of Lester Drive in 1375 East and connect the new line to the new waterlines being installed as part of the Kastlecove Phase 2 development. The project is still in the process of being designed but is anticipated to go out for bid within the next several weeks. Part of the Kastlecove Phase 2 development required the relocation and reconnection of an existing 2" waterline that is currently servicing the property owner to the southeast of the Kastlecove Phase 2 development. To save money and improve the efficiency of the project, the city approached the developer, Layne Kap, about working together. Rather than Layne installing the 2" waterline and then the city coming back later to tear out the 2" waterline and install the needed 8" waterline, he would give a credit to the city for what he would have otherwise had to install and install the portion of the 8" waterline within the boundary of the development. This would allow the future contractor of the 1375 East Waterline Project to connect to the newly installed line and avoid any conflicts between the two contractors. Layne provided costs for both the cost and credit items. These are shown in Exhibit C of the Agreement.

## **ANALYSIS**

The budget for the 1375 East Waterline Project is \$600,000. We have reviewed the unit costs of both the cost and credit items provided by Layne Kap and have found them to be at or less than the costs that we see on other similar projects. In conclusion, we feel that proceeding with this agreement is an overall savings to the project.

## WATERLINE IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT Related to Improvements for the Kastlecove Subdivision Phase 2

This Waterline Improvement Agreement ("Agreement") is related to the Kastlecove Subdivision Phase 2 Development ("Development," boundary description included as Exhibit "A") and is made and entered into this <u>12th</u> day of March, 2024 ("Effective Date") by and between South Weber City, a municipal corporation of the State of Utah ("City"), and Layne Kap of South Weber, Utah ("Developer"). City and Developer may be referred to individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties."

#### RECITALS

**WHEREAS** this Agreement is intended to specify the conditions under which the Project will be completed and the roles of the Parties;

**WHEREAS** Developer will complete the installation of certain public improvements which provide access, infrastructure, and municipal services to the Development ("Development Improvements");

**WHEREAS** City's Municipal Code allows City to enter into an agreement with developers for additional improvements and upsizing of utilities;

**WHEREAS** City desires certain modifications to be made to on-site infrastructure ("On-site Improvements");

**WHEREAS** Developer is agreeable to constructing such improvements with reimbursement from City;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and terms as more fully set forth below, Developer and City hereby agree as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

1. **Property Affected by this Agreement**. The boundary description of the Development is attached and specifically described in Exhibit A. No additional property may be added to this description for purposes of this Agreement except by written amendment to this Agreement executed and approved by the Parties hereto.

2. **Developer's Obligations.** In addition to the Development Improvements, Developer shall, at its own initial expense and in accordance with the requirements of the City code and ordinances, the requirements of the City Engineer, and all other conditions of development approval, construct and install or cause to be constructed and installed the On-site Improvements, as shown in the attached Exhibit B.

3. **Construction Cost.** Parties agree to the unit prices and approximate quantities associated with the On-site Improvements as shown in the Construction Cost Estimate, herein included as Exhibit C, and agree that the final cost will be determined by the City-verified as-constructed quantities and the previously agreed upon unit prices ("Construction Cost").

4. **Reimbursement Payments.** Within sixty (60) days of completion of the On-site Improvements, City shall pay Developer the Construction Cost. No reimbursement shall be due to Developer until the On-site Improvements have been fully installed, inspected, and approved by the City, and any real property and/or easements dedicated to City.

5. Default.

5.1. An "Event of Default" shall occur under the Agreement if any Party fails to perform its obligations hereunder where those obligations are due, and the defaulting Party has not performed the delinquent obligations within 30 days following delivery of written notice of such delinquency ("Notice of Default") to the delinquent Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the default cannot be reasonably cured within that 30-day period, a Party shall not be in default so long as that Party commences to cure the default within that 30-day period and diligently continues such cure in good faith until complete.

5.2. Parties herein each agree that should they default in any of the covenants or agreements contained herein, the defaulting Party shall pay all costs and expenses, including a reasonable attorney's fee, which may arise or accrue from enforcing this Agreement, or in pursuing any remedy provided hereunder or by the statutes or other laws of the State of Utah, whether such remedy is pursued by filing suit or otherwise, whether such costs and expenses are incurred with or without suit or before or after judgment.

6. **Remedies**. Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default. the non-defaulting Party shall have the right to exercise all of the following rights and remedies:

6.1. All rights and remedies available at law and in equity, including injunctive relief, specific performance and/or damages.

6.2. The right to withhold reasonably related approvals, licenses, permits, or other rights associated with the Project or any development described in this Agreement until such default has been cured.

6.3. The right to draw upon any security posted or provided in connection with the Project.

7. **Notice and Cure**. Once an Event of Default has occurred, the noticing Party shall have the right to cure the default and seek reimbursement from the defaulting Party for the costs incurred in effecting

such cure. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, the defaulting Party shall reimburse the curing Party for such costs of curing a default within 15 days following delivery to the defaulting Party of a written notice of such costs along with reasonable support documentation.

8. **Conflicts**. This Agreement is intended to be in harmony with all Federal and State laws, and City ordinances, codes, procedures, regulations, and rules "Laws." If any provision herein is contrary to or inconsistent with any Laws, the provisions of Laws shall govern. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Agreement and those of any document entered into prior to this Agreement, this Agreement shall govern.

9. **Severability**. If any portion of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable, any enforceable portion thereof and the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect. No rule of strict construction shall be applied against any Party. Any Party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the right to enforce such provision.

10. **Agreement to Run With the Land**. This Agreement shall be recorded in the office of the Davis County Recorder against the properties in the Project and shall run with the land and be binding on all successors in the ownership of any portion of the Project.

11. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties hereto relative to the subject matter hereof and shall not be modified or amended except by a written instrument executed by all the Parties.

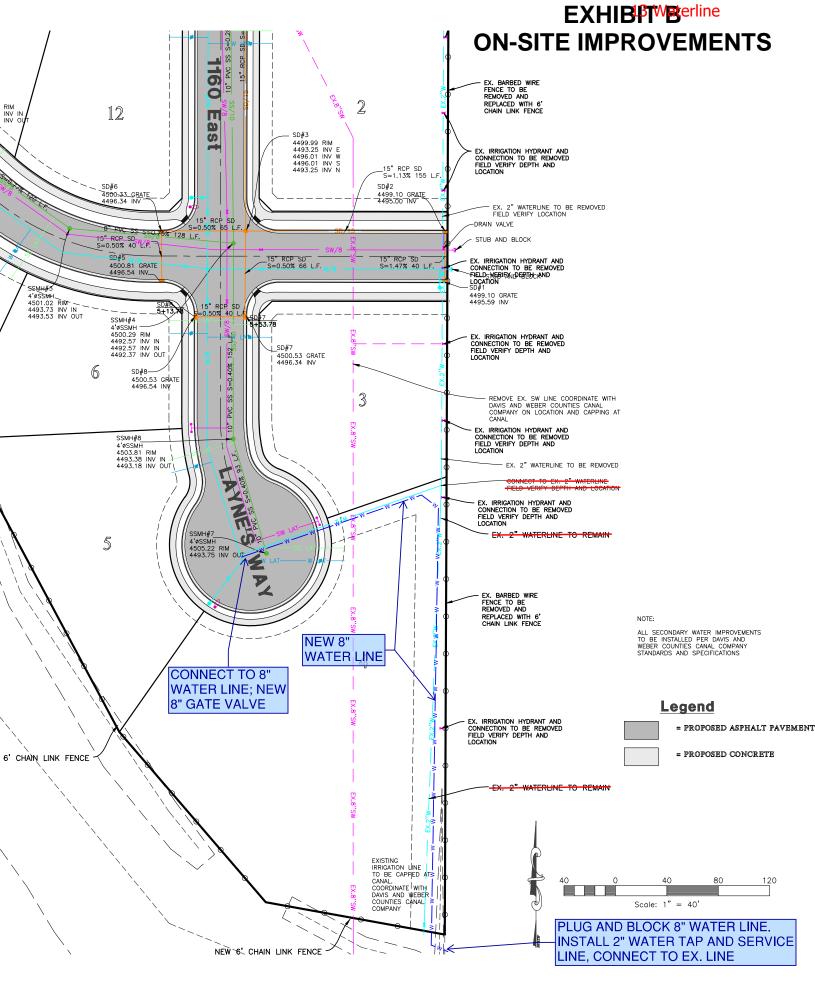
