

Resolution for Fire Retirement Fund Participation

PURPOSE

Council pass a resolution to participate in the Firefighter Retirement Fund

BACKGROUND

In fiscal year 2023 South Weber City has made the position of Fire Chief a full-time (FT) benefitted position. We are required to provide a retirement account for any employee who meets the minimum threshold for the Utah Retirement System (URS). To qualify you must work at least 2080 hours a year in the capacity of firefighter and be trained as such.

The new FT Fire Chief position meets this threshold and therefore needs to be provided with a retirement account with URS. The City participates in the URS fund for our general employees, however, this fund is the Public Employee fund. In order to provide benefits for firefighter personnel we need to also participate in the firefighter fund. This transition has been accounted for in the budget for FY23.

To participate in this fund the URS board requires a resolution from the governing body to state the intent of the organization to provide this benefit. In this resolution we declare the intent of South Weber City to participate in this fund. We also need to provide in the resolution the intent of the organization to pick up the additional contributions for firefighter employees who are currently in the Tier 2 plan for URS. This was the result of HCR9 Concurrent Resolution Authorizing State Pick Up of Public Safety And Firefighter Employee Retirement Contributions passed in 2020 which shifted the rate for Tier 2 Public Safety and Fire from 12% to 14%, however, Cities can choose to contribute up to 2% additionally to provide a better retirement benefit. Essentially by picking up the employee contributions for employees in Tier 2 the City helps provide some or all of the benefits of a Tier 1 employee.

This portion of the resolution is optional for the organization and the City can choose to not participate in the Tier 2 employer pick up. The standard practice for most organizations after HCR9 has been to pick up the additional 2%.

In South Weber City the Fire Chief is the only individual who currently qualifies for participation in this fund in the fire department.

RESOLUTION 22-42

A RESOLUTION OF THE SOUTH WEBER CITY COUNCIL REQUESTING ADMISSION TO THE FIREFIGHTERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND DECLARATION OF INTENT TO PICK UP AND PAY A PORTION OF THE REQUIRED EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTION

WHEREAS, South Weber is authorized to employ public safety personnel on a full-time basis; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to provide benefits authorized by Utah state law for the public safety personnel by the city; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council to approve and authorize coverage under Firefighters' Retirement Systems for firefighter personnel; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with federal and state law, employers may take formal action to pick up required employee contributions, which will be paid by the employer in lieu of employee contributions; and

WHEREAS, it is the city's desire to formally pick up a portion of the employee contributions;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of South Weber City, Davis County, State of Utah, as follows:

Section 1. Authorization: The City Manager and Mayor or their assignees are authorized to undertake all of the necessary actions to enroll the city in the benefit programs of the Firefighters' Retirement Systems offered by Utah Retirement Systems, including the retirement coverage and death benefit coverage for qualified employees under the laws and regulations of the Utah Retirement Systems.

Section 2. Contribution: The city of South Weber will pick up and pay required employee contributions for all city employees who are members of the Public Safety and Firefighter Tier II Contributory Retirement System, subject to a maximum of 2% of compensation for each employee.


Section 3: **Repealer Clause**: All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof, which are in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

BACKGROUND

WCG was able to update the draft Concept Plan (Alt. 2) for 2700 East based on the feedback received from the City Council at the last meeting. So, I'm passing it along. You will notice that the dedicated right-hand turn at Maverik has been removed and the dedicated right-hand turn lane at the roundabout going to 7800 South has also been removed. Jeremy Searle (WCG) will be attending the meeting and is prepared to discuss level of service, necessity vs. "nice to have", concept-level costs, function, safety, and why they are recommending what they are recommending.
