Mayor's Message

Happy New Year, South Weber Residents!!! I am excited to continue serving the citizens of South Weber as your Mayor. I would like to make you aware of some of the things you can look forward to in the future. First, the City has just finished the process of bond refinancing with Zion's Public Financing, Inc. Refinancing will shorten the length of the water bond by one to two years and generate an estimated gross savings to the City of approximately \$453,422.64, and net savings of \$223,999.14.

The outstanding performance of our South Weber City Fire Dept. last summer in containing three potentially devastating wildfires has caught the attention of the State Forestry Wildland Program (a division of the Utah Dept. of Natural Resources). They were so impressed that they donated a brush truck and a tactical tender vehicle (a \$100,000 value) to our Fire Dept., tripling our wildland vehicle fleet. A big "thank you" to Chief Tolman and our highly trained Fire Dept. for their skilled efforts in keeping our City safe and protected! (*continue on page 2*) Some of you have asked what the sales tax revenue increase is with the new Maverik gas station. South Weber's sales tax revenue is up 4.04% for the last 3 months. Sales tax revenue that we receive from Maverik is based only on sales in the store itself. The fuel tax on gas is Class C Road revenue. Part of sales tax revenue is used to fund our capital projects. Two of our recent capital projects are the complete reconstruction of 1250 E. and the new playground at Central Park.

Lastly, I will be in and out of the City offices throughout the week but would like to make myself available to visit with citizens and answer any concerns or questions. I will make every effort to be available at the City building from 12 to 2 pm on Wednesdays each week. Please feel free to drop in. I look forward to serving you all for the next 4 years. In accordance with the South Weber City Snow & Ice Removal Policy, snow plowing and/or ice control operations shall commence under the direction of the on-call Public Works employee. Notice of plowing need is typically provided from the Davis County Sheriff's Deputy on duty during late night hours. Snow removal operations will begin in accordance with the following criteria:

- A. Snow Accumulations of one inch (1") or less
- B. Snow accumulations greater than one inch but less than three inches (1"-3")
- C. Snow accumulations greater than three inches (3" +)

Streets will be plowed and salted according to the following established priority. Priorities are set based on traffic volume, public safety, access to Emergency Response Facilities, and schools.

- A. Major Collector Streets:
 - a. 475 East
 - b. 1900 East
 - c. 2100 East
 - d. Deer Run Drive
 - e. Highway 89 Frontage Roads
- B. Minor Collector Streets-all other city owned streets.
- C. Cul-de-sacs
- D. Sidewalks traversing all city owned properties.

The Park & Ride is to be contracted through a third party. The City does not have a bare asphalt snow removal policy; however, operations will continue until roads are passable. Safety of the plow operators and the public is important. Therefore, snowplowing/removal operations may be terminated after 12 to 14 hours to allow City Personnel adequate time for recovery. Operations may also be suspended during time periods of limited visibility, significant winds or drifting snow to not jeopardize the safety of city employees and equipment.

A friendly reminder that as the snow starts falling, it is against city code to move the snow from your property to someone else's or into the roadways. Our Public Works Department works hard to keep the roadways clear for emergency vehicles to make a safe response in case of a fire or a medical emergency. You never know when an emergency will happen in your home, so please have a clear path for our fire crews to operate their equipment up near your home.

Please keep your sidewalks clear, as well as any fire hydrants clear; if you have a property within South Weber City that is bordered by a sidewalk or that is next to a fire hydrant, it is your responsibility to keep it clear. As we receive complaints, and then respond to them, we will first issue a documented verbal or written warning and then issue a citation. Hopefully we will be willing to help our neighbors that cannot get out and take care of their own properties. We understand that a little wind can make removing snow a never-ending process, but we do hope that by working together, we can make all our sidewalks safe for our residents traveling on them daily.

Greetings South Weber Residents,

We hope that everyone had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! It's the cold and wintery time of the year when the snow storms are about to pick up. We would like to remind you that Winter Parking Restrictions are in effect to ensure your streets are properly cleared of snow. The parking restrictions are as follows: No on street parking between the hours of midnight and noon. A temporary parking permit may be issued through the city offices to residents or persons visiting for emergencies or other unusual circumstances with good cause shown. Furthermore, it is South Weber City Code for residents to remove snow from paved sidewalks within a reasonable time following snowfall, but no longer than 24 hours after it snows. So, let's prevent the slips and falls by keeping our sidewalks clear and providing our kids a safe place to walk, out of the slick roads, when walking to school.

Also, we understand that it is frigid outside, so we would like to remind you to not leave unattended vehicles running when warming them up. This only creates an opportunity to have your vehicle stolen, and we would prefer to deter criminals from coming into our city by keeping our property secure. The theory is if the opportunity to commit a crime is limited, those seeking to commit crimes will choose someplace else.

Last, we recently received an "Atta Boy" from Jodi, who is your school crossing guard on South Weber Drive. She was appreciative of our deputy's presence in the school zone reminding everyone to slow down.
