Snow Removal

As the winter season approaches, please be mindful of keeping sidewalks by your property clear of snow. The failure to remove snow on sidewalks and shoulders causes frequent slips and falls for pedestrians.

Keep Fire Hydrants Clear

At minimum, fire hydrants need to have enough snow or vegetation cleared away to be visible from the street. The best option is to clear a 3 foot circle around the fire hydrant, so firefighters have complete access in an emergency. In addition, don't forget to keep hydrants and fire lanes clear of vehicles at all times.

Christmas Lights

-Minimize stringing too many strands together, ensure you follow manufacturer recommendations.

-Check strands before installing to make sure there are no loose wires, broken bulbs, or other faults in the lights.

-When installing lights, install them in dry conditions, ensure you have proper ladder placement, and make someone aware that you are installing them in case of an accident.

Christmas Trees

-Choose a healthy tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

-Immediately before placing a tree in its stand, cut 5 cm (2 in.) from the base of the trunk; this can help the tree to draw up water. If the cut surface is allowed to dry, it will reduce the water uptake to the tree.

-Always keep the tree well-watered. Make sure to check the water level in the stand daily.

-Make sure that the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source (e.g. space heaters, candles, fireplaces, heat vents, or lights).

-Make sure that the tree does not block an exit.

-Only use decorative lights that have the label of a recognized testing lab. Make sure light bulbs, strings, and connections are not broken or damaged in any way.

-Always turn off tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

-Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.

-Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry and keep it away from your home/garage.
