A Holiday Message from the Davis County Sheriff's Office's-

Tis the season of gathering with family and friends. Here are some tips from the Sheriff's Office to keep this holiday season safe and crime free.

- If you have not already done so, the holiday season is a great time to get to know your neighbors. Not only can you learn a lot about your neighbors with a simple knock and talk to drop off some goodies, but you can build relationships to keep your neighborhood safe. A neighbor's watchful eye can report suspicious persons or activities around your house particularly keeping criminals from stealing packages off your porch. Incidents like these always seem to increase during the holiday season. By networking with your neighbors and increasing reports of suspicious activity, the Sheriff's Office is more likely to catch these criminals and hopefully before you become the victim.
- While out shopping or enjoying the holiday activities, stay alert to your surroundings by taking a moment to glance around for possible suspicious persons, vehicles, or situations. By acting on your instincts and reporting such suspicions, your efforts may save lives or property loss. Thieves like to patrol parking areas of department store looking for opportunities to steal your purchases. It is a great idea to secure any valuables in the trunk of the vehicle, or at a minimum out of sight. Double check to make sure your vehicle is locked, park in well-lit areas, and take a moment to look inside your vehicle before opening the door. If you have been a victim of a vehicle burglary, don't open the door and call 911 or the local law enforcement agency.
- With the aid of technology, we are shopping more and more online. It is important to validate whom we do business with when shopping online. Take a few minutes to do a little research on a company before providing them with personal and financial information. Before you become a victim of credit card theft, idtheft.gov is an excellent resource to review how to keep your transactions safe, as well as report fraud and ID theft. Also, make sure that you report all fraud, credit card and ID thefts to your local law enforcement agency. Consider giving special delivery instructions specifying where to leave your packages when having items shipped to your residence, which keeps your packages from being left unsecured on your porch for extended periods of time. Also, networking with neighbors as previously mentioned is very effective.
- Many people celebrate the season by attending holiday parties with family and friends. Enjoy these gatherings responsibly, so this time of joy does not become a time of tragedy. If you drink alcohol, watch how much you drink. Don't drink and drive, or get into a car with a driver that has been drinking. Rather, plan ahead and designate a driver if you plan to drink alcohol. Remember, time is the only way to eliminate alcohol from the body, food only slows the absorption and coffee only makes you an awake drunk. Also, family fight incidents seem to rise this time of year and often involves alcohol consumption. Everybody has opinions and every family has difficult relationships, maybe family holiday gatherings are not the best time to resolve differences.... Especially if alcohol is being consumed.
