Mayor's Message

I want to relate an experience our fire department had a couple of weeks ago.

Our guys responded to a house fire in South Weber; they were not the only ones. A quint (engine with a ladder) came from Riverdale, an engine from Layton, an ambulance from Layton, and an engine from Weber Fire District. While on the fire, South Weber had a medical emergency call. An ambulance from North Davis Fire had to come to South Weber to run that medical call. We also had four Davis Co. Sheriff's Office medics in South Weber, two for traffic control and two for medical standby. As a result, Layton medics had to cover a medical emergency in Clinton. This is a great example of how cities rely heavily upon each other during emergency situations. I want to thank South Weber's first responders, as well as those from surrounding communities, who work so diligently to keep our citizens safe.

We just had two members of our planning commission resign: Tim Grubb and Rob Osborne. I want to thank them both for their many years of service to our City. As a result, we have two new members to our planning commission: Jeremy Davis and Julie Losee. I would like to welcome them and thank them each for their desire to serve their community. I trust they will be a great asset to this organization.

A Message from the Davis and Weber Counties Canal Company

The past 2020 water season was relatively an average snowpack and a very hot and dry summer. We ended the year with low storage and our current winter is not producing the snow we need. We are in a D3 Extreme Drought condition. We hope and pray that Mother Nature will bring much more snow and precipitation to the mountains and the valley as we gear up for another water season. If not, we may have water restrictions and could end the water season early (often October 1 in drought situations).

We continue to encourage efficient use of the water and conserve where possible. Please adjust your watering based on the weather. Please strive to only water your yard based on its 'need'. The State website (http://www.conservewater.utah.gov/) states "the typical Utah household will use twice as much water outside as necessary." We encourage all users to reference the State website for their weekly watering guide. The State has also updated their regional conservation goals (https://water.utah.gov/regional-conservation-goals/). If you're interested in getting a rebate for smart controllers and other water efficient fixtures, see https://utahwatersavers.com/. Another potential measure is to delay any landscape projects that may require additional watering.

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services and we have begun to retrofit existing services with meters. We are sending water use reports to those with meters in an effort to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources. Please contact us (meters@davisweber.org) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly.

Thank you in advance for your wise water use efforts this upcoming water season. We want to continue the state ethic of efficiently using water in a wise manner. Check our website, www.davisweber.org, for further updates or restrictions. Remember to ensure your system is secure and ready for service by March 29th prior to us pressurizing the system. Often there is no need to water until May.



National Poison Prevention Week

National Poison Prevention Week is March 21—27, 2021. In recent months, UPCC has seen an increase in poison exposures due in part to more people at home and increased use of household cleaners, disinfectants and hand sanitizer during the pandemic. Please take the time to inspect your home for any medicines or household products, such as detergents, cleaning products, pesticides, and fertilizers that may not be stored properly and correct the situation immediately. Always medicines store and household products up high, away and out of from children. sight Have any poison-related questions answered by calling 1-800-222-1222.

Spring Cleanup

Have any green waste from Spring Cleaning? Throw it away at Canyon Meadows Park on April 24th. Dumpsters will be available from 8:00 am—2:30 pm and emptied regularly, so come at your convenience!

We will ONLY be accepting green waste (e.g. grass clippings, tree branches and hedge trimmings). Please do NOT bring construction material, concrete, dirt, sod, rocks, manure, pesticides, chemicals, medical or hazardous waste, pallets, or tires.

Dumpsters are 20 feet long and 6 feet high. In past years, public workers were able to help hoist heavier items into the bins. To practice social distancing, this will no longer be the case, so please make sure items are light enough for you to dispose of on your own.
