## PROPOSED UTILITY RATE CHANGES



As stated in the current Proposed Budget (to be adopted on July 1, 2023), you will see rate increases on two portions of your utility bill beginning July 1.

Robinson Waste has increased their collection charge for South Weber residents, resulting in a 2% increase in the garbage rate (\$15.15 for one can).

Additionally, the Storm Water Rate will increase by 3% to keep up with inflation (\$16.22 per month). These funds will go towards maintaining our current storm water system as well as preparing for future storm water projects.

## SPRING CODES TO REMEMBER

Spring is FINALLY here!! As we celebrate the warmer weather and the smell of flowers and rain, we'd like to remind you of two very important city regulations!

Trailers cannot be parked on the street for more than 48 hours at a time in one location.

Any weeds over 6 feet high need to be cut down and removed to prevent fire hazards.

By following these codes, you can be a good neighbor and avoid any citations!



## **SECONDARY WATER**



Did you know that South Weber is served by four different secondary water companies depending on where you live in the city?

These providers include Weber Basin Water, South Weber Water Improvement District, Davis Weber Counties Canal Company, and South Weber Irrigation.

• June: Softball


• July: 9-Square
