Davis/Weber Canal Company Message



Good news! We were able to fill the large reservoirs (Echo & East Canyon) despite the bleak snowpack with the help of some Spring Showers. We encourage wise water use as we go through the hot summer. What we save now will help us fill the reservoirs next year. One way to water your landscaping more efficiently is to get a 'smart controller' that will adjust how often your sprinklers run based on the weather. Go to UtahWaterSavers.com to find out more details for a rebate up to 50% (up to \$150).

"Smart Watering" is using a weather-based controller and applying the proper amount of water (proper sprinkler coverage, zone run times and reduce overspray). More information and links can be found on our website at www.davisweber.org.

Fire Department

You can never be safe enough when it comes to Water Safety. Drowning is the 3rd leading cause of death for children ages 3 to 11. 80% of all children drownings occur with an adult present and it is recommended that a responsible adult stays within arms reach of young children and avoids all distractions when supervising children around water.

READY, SET, SAVE



READY

Create layers of protection between water and your children. Install alarms on doors and windows that lead to the pool. Have a non-climbable five-foot fence surrounding the water. Use self-locking fence gates out of the reach of children. Have rescue equipment mounted near the pool. ASSIGN a responsible adult solely for the caring of children in the water. Take Swim lessons.

SET

Watching is the most important thing to remember. Never leave your child alone near a pool, spa, bathtub, toilet, bucket, or standing water in which a child's nose or mouth may be submerged. Have phone access near the pool. Wear PFDs (Personal Flotation Devices) that are Coast Guard approved.

SAVE

Know how to call 911. Throw! Don't Go. Throw the rescue equipment to the victim. Begin CPR.

Code Enforcement Notes



Under the new state law, Fireworks will only be allowed July 2 – 5 and July 22 – 25 instead of July 1 – 7 and July 21 – 27. The new cut off time will be 11:00 pm except for July 4th and July 24th, when the cutoff time will be 12:00 am.

City Ordinance requires that all door-to-door solicitors register with the City. Once they are registered with the City, they are issued an ID Badge from the City that includes their business license number, their name, company name and contact information, and a photo of the person. If a solicitor comes to your door and they do not have a badge, please refer them to the City.

If you have problems with a solicitor, please notify the Davis County Sheriff's Department via their Non-Emergency Phone Number: 801-444-2280. The City notifies the Davis County Sheriff's Department after each solicitor has registered. If you have questions regarding business licenses, please contact the City Office. If you have a '**NO SOLICITING**' sign, it **must be honored**.
