HAFB Offers Air Sampling in South Weber

Hill Air Force Base has begun contacting homes and businesses near areas of groundwater contamination coming from the base, to notify them that potentially harmful chemical vapors from the groundwater could be entering their homes or workplaces. Those in the affected areas will receive a certified letter from the Air Force explaining the issue and providing instructions on how to have the air inside the home or business tested. Tests will begin in October and go through March of 2019. If vapors are found above established action levels, the Air Force will take steps to prevent those vapors from entering the home or building. The drinking water has not been affected by the contamination.

The Air Force has been testing the air inside homes around Hill since 2003. As always, the testing is free, as are any future mitigation efforts. If you do not receive a certified letter, your home or business is not within an area of concern. Information about the program, including maps showing the areas eligible for sampling, is available at www.hill.af.mil/IAP.

Weber Basin Water Conservancy

Outdoor water use, which includes residential and commercial landscapes, accounts for approximately 65% of all municipal water supplies, which is why most of the emphasis for improvements in efficiency and conservation are focused in this area. However, in the winter months when outdoor water use is limited, there still exists a great opportunity to turn our attention towards indoor water conservation. A few places to start include:

1. Eliminating leaks on any water faucets, shower heads or toilet flappers
2. Only running washing machines and dishwashers with full loads
3. Taking shorter showers
4. Not leaving water running when brushing teeth
5. Putting a pitcher of water in the refrigerator so you don't have to run water to wait for it to get cold
6. Installing low flow faucet aerators, shower heads or low flow toilets.

These items can be simple to do without much effort and even the small amount of water you save will make a difference. The water savings could save you money on your water bill while helping to extend and stretch current regional water supplies for long term sustainability.

Weber Basin offers rebates on low flow toilets if your home is older than the year 2000. There are also rebates on smart controllers for your irrigation system. Check out the rebates and other great conservation information and programs by visiting

While on the site above, don't forget to check out the free landscape classes scheduled for next year to learn how you can really save a lot of water outdoors.

Code Enforcement Notes

As the winter season approaches, please be mindful of keeping sidewalks by your property clear of snow. The failure to remove snow on sidewalks and shoulders causes frequent slips and falls for pedestrians.

For our guidelines on snow removal, please see 7.01.020 of our City Code which reads as follows:

- A. Failure to Remove Unlawful: It shall be unlawful for the owner, occupant, lessor or agent of any property, abutting on a paved sidewalk, to fail to remove or have removed from such paved sidewalk, all hail, snow or sleet thereon within a reasonable time after such snow, hail or sleet has fallen. In the case of a storm between the hours of five o'clock (5:00) P.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., such sidewalks shall be cleaned before nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. of the same day.
- B. Depositing in Gutter Unlawful: It shall be unlawful for any person removing snow from the sidewalk or driveway or other areas, to deposit or blow snow, dirt, leaves or any other material in the street, nor should any of these materials be deposited in the gutter so as to clog or prevent the free flow of water therein. If you feel that there is a risk or hazard in our community in any regard, please notify the code enforcement officer so that we can address the issue quickly. It is the property owners' responsibility to clear all areas immediately surrounding their properties. If possible, please help your neighbors that may be less fortunate or not able to complete the task of removing the snow from their property.

Carbon Monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels burn incompletely. Below are some tips on installing an alarm to help you avoid the effects CO might have on you in your home.

- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes, or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO Alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting height.
- Choose a CO alarm that has a label of a recognized testing laboratory.
- Call us at 801-476-8907 to find out what number to call if the CO alarm sounds.
