I want to apologize for not having the water rate study information on the website by the time the newsletter came out last month. Staff had the information, but they were still compiling it. It is up now and has been for a few weeks. Please take time to look at it. We have a need to raise our water rates to continue the operation and maintenance of existing infrastructure. We will be having a public hearing to discuss the rate increase on May 15 at City Council Meeting.

We have had a lot of interest in the position of South Weber City Manager. We have narrowed the list down to 3 candidates who are all very strong. I know any one of them will do a great job for this City. Watch our website for more information on whom is chosen.

Lastly, South Weber City contracts with the Davis County Sheriff's Office for law enforcement services. We have just signed a one-year contract in which rates will stay pretty much the same. Unfortunately, the Davis County Commission is looking to increase rates for the contracting cities next year. With the increase, our yearly rates will nearly double. The City is looking at alternative law enforcement services with other cities and counties. We will work to find the best services for the best price for our City.

A common crime trend with the warming weather is an increase in vehicle burglaries, criminal mischief, and thefts. The Davis County Sheriff's Office would like to remind you that effective crime prevention is key in keeping South Weber Safe. By keeping your vehicles locked, not leaving valuable items inside of your vehicles, and keeping porch lights on at night will significantly reduce the risk of becoming a victim of a crime. Friendly Reminders:



- As the weather improves, please be aware of pedestrians and obey all local traffic signs!
- Please Keep pets on leash at all times whether you are walking them at 5 am or 5 pm. Also, when visiting the parks, please take a moment to read the signs so you are fully aware of what is allowed and what is not allowed.
- Height Limitations: All sidewalks shall be kept clear and unobstructed to a height of seven feet (7'). No vegetation shall be allowed to extend into the street past the curb face of the edge of the pavement where there is no curb to a height of less than fourteen feet (14').
