I hope you are all enjoying the cool weather and occasional rain storms we have had lately. I am really hoping we will have a better snow season this winter to help replenish our water supply. And speaking of water shortages, the South Weber City Council met on September 14 and discussed the pursuance of options in response to the increased dust coming from the gravel pits. One way that residents can help is by going to the Division of Air Quality (DAQ) website and submitting a complaint to the form provided by the


form provided by the DAQ when the dust is particularly bad in your neighborhood. This will prompt the DAQ to come out and do more air quality testing in South Weber City. Here is the link: https://deq.utah.gov/air-quality/complaint-form-stationary-source-compliance.

Folks, we are very excited for the new phase we are adding to Canyon Meadows Park. I hope all of you have driven past the construction on Firth Farm Road. We are adding a parking lot, some sidewalks, lights, 8 pickleball courts, one basketball court and a BMX bike track. The Council has approved landscaping in this area as well. Unfortunately, because of the drought, we cannot put the sod in until next spring. We have recently been informed that the final surface for the pickleball and basketball courts should not be applied until the sod goes in. Otherwise, these surfaces could be compromised and look discolored and grimy. As badly as we want these courts in, we understand the importance of waiting to achieve a quality product for our residents. That means the park addition probably won't be fully completed until next May. Finally, your mail-in ballots should be coming to you shortly. Please take time to become familiar with the candidates, and vote on the ones you think will best serve our City. Happy Fall, Y'all!


Mail in ballots will start to be mailed out on Oct 12th. They can be mailed back or put in the drop box located at the Family Activity Center. They must be postmarked no later than Nov 1st. In- person voting will be held on Nov 2nd at the Family Activity Center. Voting Equipment will be tested by Davis County on Oct 8th, to ensure accuracy.



Fiber to the Premises

On September 21, the City Council discussed the future of bringing fiber infrastructure to the residents of South Weber. There are a few different solutions that the Council considered in order to make this possible. The city could choose to install the fiber as a city utility, ensuring each home has access and each resident would be responsible for the utility fee associated with the service, a Utility Model. An alternative to this option would be to help facilitate the installation of the infrastructure, but rely only on the subscribers to the service to pay for the service, a Subscriber Model. After the discussion the City Council wants to pursue further the Subscriber Model as the option for the City.

The next steps in the process will be a special Work Session of City Council, currently scheduled on October 5. In this meeting the City will invite companies who operate through a Subscriber model to present more information for the Council and the public. This will give the Council the opportunity to ask pertinent questions to make a more informed response.
