You can also ask more questions about the road and the general plan at either of the open houses we are holding on October 2 and 3 from 6 to 8 pm at the Family Activity Center. Please take the time to be involved on the planning of our City's future. The General Plan is such an important tool for the future of our City and we want the whole City to be represented.

## Debris, Bushes, and Trees...Oh My!!

As a reminder from last month, please keep your trees, bushes, and other plants off the sidewalk to a height of 7 feet and at least 14 feet above the curb or street. During the winter, the branches tend to be weighed down and fall below that 14-foot requirement. Please take care of this while the weather is warm.

Having trees, weeds, bushes, or other debris overlap a sidewalk can be very dangerous for those that like to exercise using the safety of the sidewalks. When there is not enough passage along the sidewalk, it forces pedestrians into the roadway. Warnings and/or citations will be issued for obstructed sidewalks. Please do not allow landscapers to place boulders, rocks, or dirt over the sidewalk or on any portion of the roadway; you as the homeowner will be responsible for any damage to the roadways or sidewalks caused by landscapers.

### Be Advised

Secondary Water will be shutting off soon, typically between October 1 and October 15. South Weber does not provide secondary water so you will need to contact your provider to learn the exact date for your areas.
