96 ORDINANCE 12-07: Amendment To City's Zoning Map – Change of Zoning Parcel #13-97 036-0072 from Agricultural (A) to Residential Moderate (RM) Zone; Norman Fowles 98 Estate, Property Owner/Nilson Homes, Agent: A rezone application to change the property 99 from Agricultural (A) to Residential Moderate (RM) was submitted concurrently with a 100 subdivision application. Property owner is Norman Fowles Estate/Lisa Marie Ernest; agent is 101 Nilson Homes. The Planning Commission recommended approval the rezone. This change of 102 zoning complies with the General Plan Projected Land Use map and will allow for the zoning 103 compliance of the subdivision.

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Mayor Monroe asked if there was any public comment.

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Gary Girres, 2540 E. 7800 S., stated the zoning change from agricultural to residential moderate zone will impact this area by increasing traffic. He feels 7800 South needs to be addressed prior to approving this subdivision. He is specifically concerned about the corner by Rhea Westbroek's home. He is also concerned about children walking to the High Mark Charter School. Mr. Girres has a major concern with individuals driving at high speed down the frontage road and traffic turning from 7800 South onto the frontage road.

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128 129 **Doug Austin, 2550 E. 7800 S.**, stated at the Planning Commission meeting there were a number of concerns brought up by neighbors surrounding this property. He would like to know if the council is aware of those issues. Mayor Monroe stated the council received a copy of the minutes from that meeting. Mr. Austin is concerned about the connecting road and it being a hazard in the winter time. He stated there are about five turns in a neighborhood with many children. He is also concerned about children walking to the High Mark Charter School. He stated there is poor site distance at the stop sign on the corner by Farrell Poll's home. Mr. Austin stated all the storm runoff on Daniel Lane brings mud and dirt across the street, in which the city is responsible for that. Councilmember Poll explained that he has tried to get the Public Works Director to address the stop sign and move it out 10 ft. He stated the problem with 7800 South goes way back. It is a checker board as far as who owns what. He can understand each individual concerns and knows it is a dilemma. He feels the city should look at widening the street from Daniel Way all the way to the frontage road. Councilmember Poll stated the connection of the road is in the city's master plan. He hopes that because it is not a straight away that individuals will try to avoid that connecting road by going straight on Deer Run Drive. He stated two cul-de-sacs would be nice; however, the city has to look at the flow of traffic and emergency access.

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134 135 **Rod Westbroek, 2538 E. 8150 S.,** stated he is currently serving on the Planning Commission. He has lived on 7800 South practically his whole life. He measured the road on Sunday and found that there is 20 ft. of asphalt. He feels if the street is going to connect, the city should look at what can be done to improve 7800 South. He doesn't think it would be too hard to take from Daniel Way (2600 East) on up to the frontage road and widen the street. He feels from Daniel Way (2600 East) west should be left the way it is.

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Councilmember Thomas moved to close the public hearing for Ordinance 12-07. Councilmember Hilton seconded the motion. Councilmembers Hilton, Lusk, Poff, Poll, and Thomas voted yes. The motion carried.

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Gary Girres, 2540 E. 7800 S., stated at the Planning Commission meeting they discussed the need for more water. He would like to know if the council has heard from Weber Basin concerning whether or not there is enough water for this subdivision. He also reiterated the need for safety concerns.

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184 185 **Rorie Stott**, representing South Weber Water Improvement District, explained that there is a certain amount of water per every acre that they cover. Because of the overuse of water early in the year, water has been decreased. He stated the secondary water line is a 4" line and it isn't sufficient. He stated the line coming down Fowles needs to tie into it. He then asked if the High Mark Charter School has looked at installing a walkway from the subdivisions. Mayor Monroe stated it isn't the city's easement to pursue. He explained that the school would need to work that out with surrounding property owners.

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188 Mr. Austin complained about the lack of secondary water pressure. He feels the whole area 189 needs to be addressed sooner or later. He stated when the school is running their water, his water 190 pressure is decreased. Rorie stated those issues need to be addressed to the South Weber Water

Motion died due to lack of a second:

Councilmember Poll asked if there is a cost estimate for improving Daniel Way (2600 East) and 7800 South. Rodger stated there are studies that prove wider roads create higher speed. He stated there are cheaper options, such as moving the stop sign, striping the road, etc. He does feel there are things that need to be done to the road and it will take time. Brandon Jones, City Engineer, feels the road does need to be reviewed, but those items should be addressed with the city and not with the development of this subdivision. Brandon stated the storm water created by this subdivision has been addressed; however, the storm water on Daniel Way (2600 East) and 7800 South would need to be addressed along with the improvements needed.

Bruce Nilson stated the name of the subdivision is not "Gardner's Cove", but should be "Gardeners Grove" Subdivision as per Mr. Fowles wishes.

Councilmember Poff asked if the city is comfortable with the retaining wall. Brandon stated the developer did not submit a design of the retaining walls; however, there is a requirement that an engineer would need to sign off on the design.

Councilmember Poll moved to approve Resolution 12-23 - Final Plat – Gardeners Grove 10-lot Subdivision located at approximately 7862 S. 2450 East; Norman Fowles Estate, Property Owner/Nilson Homes, Developer and direct the city staff to look at improving 7800 and moving the stop sign from Daniel Way (2660 East) to 7800 South. Joseph Gertge, 8031 S. 2250 E., stated the council should have his resume and his accomplishments in their packet. He left his term of being mayor in 2008. He would like to see some pressure put on the gravel pits.

Angie Petty, 7692 Cornia Dr., stated she is currently a homemaker. She grew up in a small farming community. She loves this community even more than the city she grew up in. She has worked with the Weber County Dairy Commission. She recently served with her husband as the chairpersons for the Coke wagon. She enjoys meeting new people. She has worked in the banking business. She feels the skills she learned while employed will help as a councilmember. Concerning the gravel pits, she knows it is an income for the city so she wouldn't be took quick to kick them out.

Sam Stokes, 7898 S. 2175 E., stated he moved to South Weber when he was fifteen years old. He has lived in his home with his wife for two years now. He would like to take an active role in serving the community. He is CERT certified. He did run for the council in the last election. He is currently working for IHC while attending Weber State University. He is willing to research and put forth the effort to do his best. He loves this community. Concerning the gravel pits, he would like to see them hold up to the promises they have made. He doesn't want them to keep digging and digging until the pit isn't useable.

Merv Taylor, 8062 S. 2300 E., stated he has lived in South Weber for 23 years. He just retired from law enforcement. He has the time to serve. He has attended many council meetings in many cities. He knows budgets. He has served on the South Weber Planning Commission as well as the Sewer Committee. He is willing to concentrate on what is good for the city as a whole. Councilmember Thomas moved and Councilmember Hilton seconded motion to go into work meeting.

WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OPTIIZATION ANALYSIS REPORT – Hansen, Allen & Luce,

Inc.: Rodger stated that the city has had a static water model, which would take flowtestings, pressures and zones and give us a snapshot in time of the water system. This optimization model is a more dynamic model, a "video" of our water system which we can look to at any time. He explained the water system is made up of pipes. Valves, pressure relief, water tanks, size of tanks, hydrants, when people use the water, where we get the water from, etc. Hansen, Allen & Luce performed a study and provided the "video" which allows us to look for things we can do better and more efficiently and how we can save money in that delivery.

Steve Jones from Hansen, Allen & Luce presented the dynamic model. He explained that it is like a movie instead of a picture book, which can run through a day or several days. He displayed and ran the model, with a tracer on the well. Mr. Jones said once the model is run, you can change settings in the computer rather than in the system. The model shows the percent of water coming from the well, and where the water is going from the well. The program also allows you to look at specific property and see if there is a pressure issue.

Mr. Jones said overall the city's system performs quite well. He said he found some ways the city could make the system more efficient. He said the water tanks hold a lot of water, and if they are full all the time it allows the water to get old without using it. Mr. Jones said it is good to let the water in the tanks fluctuate down and fill back up as it circulates the water and refreshes it. He said the city can fill the tanks when water is cheaper and use during high cost of energy periods. He said running the pumps on the off peak schedule and only use at night could cut the power bill in half. He stated the model shows we could do that, rely on the tanks during the peak periods. Rodger stated that puts money back in the water fund through the savings.

Mr. Jones said this is free software and the public works employees will be trained to use it. Mayor Monroe said the staff should bring findings to the council in six months and see how the model is working for us.

Councilmember Poll was excused at this time.

CITIZEN REQUEST: Lenette Girres Snouffer, Discuss Need for Sidewalk to High Mark Charter School/Safety Issues: Ms. Snouffer stated her two children attend High Mark Charter School, and there are concerns with speed and and the need for sidewalks. She said parents are parking on the the north side of South Weber Drive. Ms. Snouffer has a petition she has been having people sign. She said she understands the UDOT owns the road. She requested that the city provide a letter of support on this safety issue, and she will keep going (toward getting sidewalks in) from there. Ms. Snouffer said that the children are worth it, and we don't want a fatality on our hands. Councilmember Thomas said he supports providing a letter, and he suggested that Ms. Snouffer contact Representative Brad Dee, who would have the most influence with UDOT.

Discussion regarding UDOT's Safe Sidewalks program was discussed. This is a 75/25 matching grant. Rodger stated that last year they only had \$160K to distribute among Region 1. Mayor Monroe addressed that if they wish to have a sidewalk from 2100 East to the Frontage Road, there may be some easement issues.

Rob Osborne said the school's position is that the board has decided they would like to get with UDOT to get a crosswalk at the school and at 2100 East. He said that crossing guards are less expensive than installing a sidewalk. He said their second choice would be to go up the hill.

Rodger will draft a letter of support. Ms. Snouffer will continue with the petition. We will also continue to try for the Region 1 grant money. Mayor thanked Ms. Snouffer for bringing this to the Council's attention.

CITIZEN REQUEST: Bo & Tamie Call, discuss Secondary Water for Canyon meadows Detention Basin: Mr. Call stated that the Canyon Meadows detention basin is full of weeds. The Calls have been been putting horses there to keep the weeds down for the last couple years. Mr. Call said that last year it rained and kept the area green, but there is a need to have water on the property. Mr. Call said they are willing to put secondary water in if the city would approve it. He would like the City to work with them on a longer term commitment so the Calls are not asked to leave after putting in expense to put in secondary water. Mayor Monroe said we have other detention basins that we water and maintain. Rodger stated having animals on the property keeps the vegetation down, however there are some plants the horses won't eat. He feels there is a mutual benefit in that the animals keep the vegetation down and the city isn't having to go in and cut them down. He can see how having secondary water would be a benefit. Councilmember Gertge asked if there are wetland rules we have to adhere to. Mr. Call reiterated they are willing to put the secondary water there in an effort to make the area better. Mrs. Call stated it is \$2,500 to hook up to the system. Rodger said there will also be the cost of the work to put it in. Councilmember Thomas, Councilmember Poff, and Mayor Monroe all stated they are not opposed to an agreement. It was discussed that if the Calls put forth the expense of putting it in, then the city could give them ten or fifteen years of use. Councilmember Thomas proposed directing staff to draft an agreement. Mayor Monroe agreed, stating this shall come back to the council for approval.

DISCUSSION – EASTON VILLAGE SUBDIVISION ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY: Councilmember Thomas said this needs to go to the Planning Commission for a recommendation so he is wondering why it is on this agenda. Layne Kap said he wanted to find out if he is wasting his time going to Planning Commission. Rodger said the Planning Commission's recommendation will come to the City Council, which is the approving body.

The reason for the 70 foot right of way was discussed. Mayor Monroe said the city wanted a wider sidewalk for people to walk on. Rodger said this makes more sidewalk for the city to have to fix, intermixing cross sections doesn't make sense, and this is not going to be a walkable community. OTHER ITEMS: Fire Flows - Fire Chief Tom Graydon arrived at this time. He reported the new waterline increased the fireflow in the area to 2,000 gallons per minute. Rodger said when the city was looking to award the project, there was reluctance because we didn't know for sure these were the best ones to do, but now we can see the projects we selected were beneficial. Secondary Water: Mayor Monroe reported the secondary water has been turned off by Weber Basin because the users used up the allocations. Training with Pam Gardiol: Rodger will reschedule for October. Policy Priorities: Rodger did a deviation scoring from the information gathered in February. He said there are a lot of discrepancies in the viewpoints between staff and council regarding the city's goals. Rodger will send the information to the Council. He said once the council can pin down the policies, the staff can implement programs to follow the policies. He said the staff's goals can work up to the policies and the staff can provide reports quarterly to tell what they have done to help achieve the goals. 

GARBAGE COLLECTION CONTRACT

SOUTH WEBER CITY CORPORATION, a municipal corporation of 1600 East South Weber Drive, South Weber City, State of Utah, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and ROBINSON WASTE SERVICES, INC., a Utah corporation, with offices at 2719 North Fairfield Road, Layton, Utah, hereinafter referred to as the "Collector", hereby agree as follows:

RECITALS

Ι

The City is a municipal corporation of the State of Utah and provides garbage removal services by Contract to the residents and inhabitants of the City.

H

The Collector is in the business of collecting and removing garbage and waste for appropriate disposal.

Ш

The City has refuse containers designed for automatic curbside pickup.

IV

The parties desire to enter into a Contract under the terms of which Collector shall remove garbage and waste for appropriate disposal.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the parties do hereby contract and agree as follows:

1. GARBAGE COLLECTION

- A. Collector agrees to pick up garbage from curbside at each residential unit, including apartments, duplexes, and all other types of residential units and small commercial units, presently being served by the City, and each new residential unit when constructed on an improved street within the City limits.
- B. Pickup shall be not less than once a week, on the same day of each Week, except where special circumstances exist and the City has granted advanced permission in writing to make pickups on a different day of the week.
- C. Collector will include service at City facilities, hereinafter described.
- D. Service shall also include Spring and Fall clean-ups and annual Christmas tree pickup as hereinafter described.
- E. Collector shall provide special assistance to elderly and handicapped residents as hereinafter described.
- F. Collector shall use automated equipment capable of properly picking up and handling the automated trash containers owned by the City.

2. <u>COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL AND INSTITUTIONAL</u> <u>ESTABLISHMENTS</u>

Collector may deal directly with business, commercial, industrial and institutional establishments, on the same basis as other commercial garbage collectors, and all sums collected by Collector from such entities shall be paid directly to the Collector as compensation for servicing such entities and Collector shall not be required to account to the City for such accounts.

3. EXCLUSIVE RIGHT

During the term of this Agreement, the Collector is granted an exclusive right to collect all residential solid waste covered by this Agreement and generated within

the City. Should the City determine in the future to offer recycling collection and disposal services to its residents, Collector shall have the right to negotiate to provide such services. Such agreement shall be made by written addendum to this Contract.

4. CLEAN AND WORKMANLIKE MANNER

Collector agrees that garbage pickup provided for in this Contract shall be done by Collector in a clean and workmanlike manner and with as little inconvenience as possible to the inhabitants of the City.

Any garbage spilled, dropped or scattered in any manner by the Collector or employees or agents thereof, shall be gathered or picked up immediately by the Collector and not allowed to remain in the street. If garbage is missed at any pickup stop through no fault of the occupant, then the Collector agrees to return to the pickup stop and make the collection as and when requested to do so by the City. Collector agrees that all pickup or collection under this Contract shall be done in accordance with the ordinances, rules and regulations of the City and the State of Utah to the satisfaction of the City.

The Collector shall perform the service provided for herein in such a manner as not to constitute a nuisance within the City.

5. CONTAINERS LOCATION AND CARE

A. All approved garbage containers shall be placed by the customers within 2 feet of the blacktop or in the gutter if curb and gutter is present, and at a location that is readily accessible to the Collector and its equipment, unless previous arrangements are made between the Resident and the Collector. If there are 2 or more containers, the containers must be a minimum of 4 feet apart. Access to the containers shall not be blocked and the collection vehicle must have clear access to the containers.

- B. Containers shall all be automated containers mutually acceptable to the Collector and the City. Collector shall not be obligated or required to collect garbage in or from any other form, type or size container.
- C. The Collector shall use care in handling such containers to insure that they are not damaged during the collection process.
- D. The containers provided for herein shall be furnished by the City at no cost or expense to the Collector, except in case of damage to such containers through carelessness or negligence on the part of the Collector.
- E. The Collector shall not be liable for damage caused by previous collectors.

<u>**6.**</u> <u>**TERMS**</u>

- A. The initial term of this Contract shall be for a period of five (5) years commencing October 1, 2007 and ending September 30, 2012.
- B. The Collector shall have an option to extend or renew this Contract for additional five (5) year periods in accordance with Section 7, Subparagraph B, provided that performance is satisfactory with the City.
- C. This Contract may be terminated with the consent of both parties, or in the case one party breaches the contract, the other party may terminate the contract. In such case, the party terminating the contract shall give ninety (90) days written notice by certified mail, whereupon the contract shall terminate at the expiration of the ninety (90) days unless the default is remedied to the satisfaction of the terminating party prior to the expiration of the ninety (90) days.

7. PAYMENT

A. As consideration for the faithful performance of Collector's

obligations hereunder, the City agrees to pay Collector the sum of \$4.44 per residential unit per month. An additional \$1.50 per residential unit per month, per each additional automated container.

- B. Changes in rates for extension or renewal periods will be negotiated by the Collector and the City. Such adjustment shall be made by written addendum to this Contract.
- C. The rate may be adjusted annually for inflation or deflation in accordance with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) throughout the term of the contract and any extensions thereof.
- D. Payment for services provided for herein shall be made by the City on or before the last day of each month for services rendered during the prior calendar month.
- E. The Collector may petition the City at any time for additional rate and price adjustments at reasonable times on the basis of, but not limited to, unusual changes in its cost of operations, such as made necessary by revised laws, ordinances or regulations, changes in location or disposal sites and/or increased fuel expenses. In the event the petition is found by the City to be reasonable under the circumstances, the rates may be appropriately adjusted.

8. CLAIMS AND INSURANCE

A. It is understood and agreed that Collector performs the services covered by this Contract as an independent contractor and not as an employee or agent of the City, and that the purposes of this Contract are to secure for the City the collection of garbage from residences within the City in a clean, orderly and workmanlike manner. Subject to the terms herein, Collector shall perform and carry out the responsibilities of this Contract in its discretion and without interference to or direction from the City.

- B. The Collector shall indemnify and hold harmless, the City and its officers, agents, servants, and employees from claims, damages, costs, expenses, and attorney's fees incident to any work done in the performance of this Agreement or by or in consequence of any negligence or act or omission of the Collector of its employees, agents or subcontractors in fulfilling this contract except to the extent the claims, damages, costs or expenses result from the negligence of the City. The Collector shall also obtain and maintain in effect during the term of this Agreement vehicle liability insurance, together with a comprehensive general liability policy covering its operations pertaining to the City, both with liability limits not less than \$1,000,000 property damage and \$1,000,000 bodily injury, naming the City as an additional insured. Certificates of Insurance shall be filed with the City before work is commenced by the Collector.
- C. The Collector shall carry, with an insurance company authorized to transact business in the State of Utah, a policy that fulfills all the requirements of the Workmen's Compensation Act of Utah, including all legal requirements for occupational diseases.

9. EQUIPMENT, LABOR

Collector shall furnish all of its labor, material and equipment of any kind and description necessary for the performance of the obligations of this Contract.

10. VEHICLES, DUMPING

A. All vehicles used by Collector shall be sanitary and of leak-proof construction and shall not be overloaded so as to create the likelihood of spilling or dropping garbage therefrom. All vehicles shall be in a safe operable condition and shall conform to all applicable Federal, State and local safety requirements. All garbage shall be delivered by Collector to the Davis Country Solid Waste Management Recovery

District (now known as Wasatch Energy Systems) for disposal in accordance with the ordinances, rules and regulations governing the use of the Wasatch Energy Systems Plant and/or Landfill operated by Wasatch Energy Systems. The city will pay all disposal fees charged by Wasatch Energy Systems for garbage delivered under the terms of the agreement.

- B. The Collector will pick up refuse at the front of each residential unit between 6:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on the day agreed upon between the Collector and the City for refuse collection.
- C. The Collector shall advertise and have a listed telephone number and shall have a responsible person at the number from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. during every collection day with the authority to make decisions relevant to operations under this contract. In addition, an employee of the firm shall answer the telephone to receive complaints and inquiries from the public related to this contract. All complaints shall be resolved in an expeditious manner within the twenty-four (24) hour period following receipt of the complaint.

11. **DEFINITION OF GARBAGE**

- A. The term "Garbage" shall be construed to include but not be limited to any organic refuse or waste, animal or vegetable matter (except body waste), cans, bottles, rubbish, waste paper, refuse, rags, crockery, trash, Christmas trees, and household refuse or debris of any description or kind.
 - Material which may be damaging to equipment will not be picked
 up.
 - C. All garbage shall be placed in the aforedescribed containers.
 - D. The City agrees to make its best efforts to enforce its refuse

collection ordinance, to-wit: that residents shall place all refuse in a city-owned automated refuse-collection container; that residents shall be responsible for keeping the refuse in said containers until it is picked up; and that residents shall not put out for collection such items as hot ashes, car parts, mattresses, floor covering, animal carcasses, chunks of cement, dirt, sand, rocks, sod, flammable liquid, hazardous waste, or anything that will not fit in an automated refuse collection container. Collector shall have the right to refuse to collect refuse in violation of the above regulations.

12. SPECIAL SERVICES

- A. Collector will provide container service to city facilities at no additional charge to the City. A rate for facilities added after October 1, 2007 will be negotiated with the Collector.
- B. Collector will provide container service for "Country Fair Days" at no additional charge to the City. Tipping fees to be paid by the City.
- C. Collector will provide roll-off container service for spring/fall clean-up at no additional charge to the City. Containers to be placed at City facilities are for use by City residents only. Tipping fees to be paid by the City.
- D. Collector shall provide Christmas tree pick-up at no additional charge on a date to be determined by the City and the Collector.
- E. For residents certified by the City Manager as being too ill or infirm to move the 90-gallon automated refuse collection container from its storage place to the street and back to its storage space, the Collector agrees to perform such service for the resident at no extra charge to the City.

13. SUPERVISION BY CITY MANAGER

All work, including points of collection, shall be carried out in accordance

ADDENDUM TO CONTRACT FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION BETWEEN SOUTH WEBER CITY AND ROBINSON WASTE SERVICES ENTERED INTO SEPTEMBER 25, 2007

WHEREAS South Weber City entered into a contract with Robinson Waste Services for Garbage Collection service; and

WHEREAS the terms of the contract allow for modification of payment terms for increased fuel expense; and

WHEREAS diesel fuel prices have increased substantially over the last several months; and

WHEREAS Robinson Waste Services has requested a fuel surcharge effective May 2008; and

WHEREAS the South Weber City Council has reviewed Robinson Waste's request and deems it is in the best interest of the City to amend the agreement with Robinson Waste to include a fuel surcharge;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed and understood that the contract between South Weber City and Robinson Waste Services shall be amended to include a fuel surcharge with the base rate established at \$3.75 per gallon and a consumption rate of 33%. Diesel fuel prices used for this calculation shall be the monthly average retail fuel price published by the Department of Energy.

Scott read from city staff report ---- Emily will you please insert the staff report.

Commissioner Hyde asked if there was any public comment.

Doug Ostead, 2550 E. 7800 S., is concerned about public safety and the water issue. He feels this subdivision will create a public safety issue. He stated the road system is not designed as a collector road. He stated 7800 South is very narrow. The stop sign is not very well used. He feels additional traffic will create a freeway. Concerning the water issue, he stated the new High Mark Charter School is very low and has used lots of water on their fields. His water pressure has decreased because of the school. He feels there needs to be some pressure pumps in the system or larger pipes.

Keith Maw, 2600 E. 7913 S., stated he is adjacent to lot 3. He asked if the ditch on the property will be covered and will there be a fence. He is also concerned about the water pressure.

Scott stated from residential to residential there is no requirement for fencing. He stated if the ditch runs along the property lines, there is a utility easement. Nate Reeve stated the ditch is abandoned and has no source of water.

Gregg Belnap, 7841 S. 2600 E., stated he is opposed to Gardner's Cove Subdivision. He stated a lot of the people who chose to build in the area want to have a dead end road. He if very much opposed to the road going through. He feels the amount of traffic will be far more than what everyone anticipates. He suggests the developer construct a cul-de-sac. He stated there are approximately 167 homes that may choose to use this access. He stated the water pressure is low. He also feels there are safety concerns.

Title: Request for Variance – Easton Village Subdivision

The final plat for the Easton Village Subdivision was approved by the City Council by Resolution 12-20 on August 28, 2012.

The Kap brothers, developers, have requested a variance to the subdivision design standards by allowing a 60 foot right of way throughout the development, rather than the 70 foot right of way as required by the standards.

The following is City Code regarding allowing variances to the subdivision requirements:

11-2-3: VARIANCES:

"Where the subdivider can show that a provision of these general requirements and minimum standards of design would cause unnecessary hardship if strictly adhered to and where because of the topographical or other conditions peculiar to the site, in the opinion of the planning commission, the planning commission can recommend to the city council and the city council may authorize an adjustment, and adjustment thus authorized is required to be entered in writing in the minutes of the planning commission and city council and the basis upon which departure was justified set forth. (Ord. 95-7, 4-11-1995, eff. 4-12-1995)"

Also, see City Code 11-4-4 regarding right-of-way requirements.

On September 27, the Planning Commissioner considered the request and made recommendation to the City Council that the developer follow the ordinance as written.

APPROVAL OF 24 MAY 2012 MEETING MINUTES: Commissioner Grubb moved to table the minutes of 24 May 2012 due to lack of a quorum. Commissioner Perkins seconded the motion. Commissioners Grubb, Perkins, and Stott voted yes. The motion carried.

APPROVAL OF 23 AUGUST 2012 MEETING MINUTES: Commissioner Grubb moved to table the minutes of 23 August 2012 due to lack of a quorum. Commissioner Perkins seconded the motion. Commissioners Grubb, Stott, and Perkins voted yes. The motion carried.

MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO CITY COUNCIL REGARDING THE USE OF 60' RIGHT-OF-WAY THROUGHOUT THE EASTON VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT – REQUEST FOR RECOMMENDATION MADE BY LAYNE KAP:

Calvin Kap. 985 E. South Weber Dr., approached the Planning Commission and requested they look at the possibility of a 60' right of way for all of the streets throughout the Easton Village subdivision.

Commissioner Stott explained the city standard that was updated and modified in 2009 concerning the amendment to right of ways from 60' to 70'. The Planning Commission made the recommendation May 28, 2009 and the City Council made final approval August 11, 2009.

Commissioner Stott stated the 70' wide street standard is the preferred standard, unless the road is an extension of an existing 60' wide street. This is clearly defined in Title 10 Zoning Regulations, Chapter 5 Zoning Districts, density subsection 3:

"3. The use of seventy foot (70') wide road rights of way shall be the preferred standard, but the use of sixty foot (60') wide road rights of way may be approved by the city where the road is an extension of an existing sixty foot (60') wide right of way. (Ord. 09-08, 8-11-2009)"

Calvin Kap is concerned because the surrounding easements are 60' and yet in the middle the city is requiring a 70' right of way. He explained if an individual has a four door pickup and parks on the driveway, the truck would block the sidewalk. Scott stated that is if the home is constructed at a 25' setback. He stated there are other options with moving the garage back further. He explained that you can put the front of the home in the front of the setback. Calvin stated eventually the city will have to replace wider sidewalks. Emily stated the City Engineer isn't concerned with that since the city rarely replaces sidewalk. Calvin stated it is less maintenance to shovel a 4' sidewalk verses a 6' sidewalk. Scott stated your dealing with existing conditions and you are the first developer to start with the 70' wide street. Scott stated the city has an ordinance in place that requires a 70' wide street and the city staff is required to abide by the ordinance. Scott stated those streets that connect to 1160 E. and Lester Drive were permitted to stay 60' wide.

Commissioner Perkins stated the City Council may or may not agree with the Planning Commissions recommendation. Scott reiterated the responsibility of the city staff to follow the city ordinance. He understands the developer's concern, but there isn't a reason to go against the city ordinance. Commissioner Grubb suggested the City Council look at being consistent throughout the subdivision. Commissioner Grubb feels the Planning Commission did accommodate the majority of the streets in the subdivision. Commissioner Grubb stated the wider sidewalks and park strips allow for trees to be planted and a walkable sidewalk.

Commissioner Perkins feels if there is an economic hardship, other than the fact that the developer just doesn't like it, then maybe he would feel differently. He is in favor of the 70' wide street. Commissioner Stott stated the law doesn't allow for an economic variance. He explained when the ordinance was reviewed in 2009, individuals wanted wider sidewalks.

Commissioner Grubb moved to recommend to the City Council that they follow the ordinance as written. The City Council may want to review a set standard for an entire subdivision. Those streets that connect to 1160 E. and Lester Drive are permitted to stay 60' wide. Commissioner Perkins seconded the motion. Commissioners Grubb, Stott, and Perkins voted yes. The motion carried.

SOUTH WEBER CITY CODE

TITLE 11 SUBDIVISION REQUIREMENTS

11-4-4: STREETS, EASEMENTS AND NUMBERS:

B. Width Of Public Right Of Way Or Street: The minimum width of a proposed public right of way or street measured from lot line to lot line shall be as shown in the general plan, or if not shown on such plan, shall be:


- 1. Major Streets: Not less than one hundred ten feet (110').
- 2. Collector Or Feeder Streets: Not less than seventy six feet (76').
- 3. Local Streets: Local service streets shall be no less than seventy feet (70') in width except in some cases where the street is an extension of an existing narrower street or where neighborhood conditions warrant. In that case the minimum width, at the sole discretion of the city council, may be reduced to no less than sixty feet (60').
- 4. Exceptions: Where public right of way is desired by the city but existing conditions do not permit the minimum width, the sidewalk requirements may be adjusted to allow a road width of not less than foty one feet (41') from top of back of curb to top of back of curb. (Ord. 09-07, 8-11-2009)

- **1.12 GUARANTEE OF WORK:** The subdivider shall warrant and guarantee the improvements as given in Title 11 "Subdivision Regulations" of the South Weber City Code.
- **1.13 STREETS:** Streets shall conform to the following standards:
 - A. Total width of the right-of-way shall be standard at 70-feet for Residential streets and 76-feet for Collector streets. Minor Arterial streets (94-feet wide) and Major Arterial streets (110-feet wide) will be required where requested by the Planning Commission.
 - B. Grades of streets shall be a minimum of 0.50% and a maximum of 8.0% for Arterial streets, 10.0% for Collector streets, and 12.0% for Residential streets.
 - C. Surfacing:
 - (1) All streets shall have a minimum of 3-inches of bituminous surface course.
 - (2) All surface course shall be installed over a compacted gravel base course at least 8-inches thick.

No bituminous surface course shall be installed without proper notification to the City and utility companies. The Contractor shall raise all monuments, valve boxes and manholes to grade with concrete collars as shown on the Standard Drawings.

The maximum length of blocks shall be one thousand two hundred feet (1,200') and the minimum length of blocks shall be five hundred feet (500'). Minor terminal streets (cul-de-sacs) shall have a maximum length of four hundred feet (400') from center of the street right-of-way, along the centerline of the road, to the beginning of the turn around. Each cul-de-sac shall be terminated by a turnaround of not less than one hundred twenty feet (120') in diameter. Where a street is designed to remain only temporarily as a dead-end street, an adequate temporary turnaround shall be provided as detailed in the Drawings.

- **1.14 SIDEWALKS:** Concrete sidewalks shall be installed where required by the Planning Commission. Sidewalks shall be four to eight feet wide and shall be 4-inches thick, except at driveways where the thickness shall be increased to 6-inches. A 4-inch layer of untreated base course will be required unless otherwise designated by the City Engineer.
- 1.15 CURB AND GUTTER: Concrete high back curb and gutter (30-inches wide) shall be installed as the City Standard. Concrete roll curb and gutter may be installed in special cases where allowed by the Planning Commission and recommended by the City Engineer. Curb and gutter shall be located and constructed as shown on the standard drawings. A minimum 4-inch layer of untreated base course will be required under curb and gutter unless otherwise designated by the City Engineer.

FINAL PLAT: EASTON VILLAGE SUBDIVISION, PHASE ONE

WHEREAS, the South Weber City Planning Commission reviewed final plat for Easton Village Phase One 16-lot Subdivision located at approx. 1100 East and Lester, at a public hearing on 28 June 2012, and has recommended approval of the final plat subject to conditions; and

WHEREAS, a review by staff of the final plat and plans has determined the conditions set by the Planning Commission have been met.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the South Weber City Council that the final plat of Easton Village Subdivision Phase One is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Plat: Verbage shall be added to the plat to inform future property owners of possible contaminants in the area.
- 2. Storm Drain: Prior to recording of the plat, a development agreement shall be finalized between the developer and the City for the construction of a regional detention basin located within the Easton Village Subdivision and adjacent property.
- 3. Ingress/Egress: Prior to recording of the plat, a development agreement shall be finalized ensuring the construction of two ingresses and egresses into and out of the subdivision in conjunction with the next phase of development.
- 4. Improvements Required Prior To Building Permit: Before the issuance of any building permits, improvements as indicated on improvement plans must be completed, inspected and approved by the city, and all professional fees incurred to date shall be paid in full prior to any building permits being issued.
- 5. Escrow: Prior to recording of the final plat, the developer will be required to enter into an escrow agreement with the City to ensure completion of all public improvements to be installed as required by subdivision approval. The escrow amount shall be equal to the City Engineer's approved estimated cost of all required public improvements plus 15% of the total cost of all required improvements for contingencies, plus an additional 10% of the total cost of all required improvements as a guarantee fee, for a total of 125% of the City Engineer's approved estimated cost of all required improvements.
- 6. Recording Period: The developer shall submit the plat and developers agreement to the City within 120 days from the date of approval, along with a check for recording fees [SWC Code Code 11-2-2(C)], for recording of the plat with the County Recorder's office. Plats not recorded within 120 days of final approval by the City Council shall be null and void and must be resubmitted to the City Council.
- 7. Electronic Data: The developer shall submit electronic copies (both dwg and pdf formats) of the plat and construction drawings prior to recording of the plat. Electronic data should be compatible with AutoCAD2008 or earlier.
- 8. Preconstruction: Prior to construction, the developer and construction contractor must hold a preconstruction conference with the City Engineer and City staff to review construction requirements.


- 9. Official Construction Drawings: Prior to the preconstruction meeting, two sets of mylar drawings must be submitted to the City Engineer to serve as official construction drawings.
- 10. Commencement of Work: No work on improvements shall be commenced until finalized construction drawings have been approved by the City, final approval of the subdivision plan has been issued by the City Council, the plat has been recorded with the county, escrow funds secured and proof provided to the City, and a Preconstruction Meeting held with the City Engineer and other applicable entities. [SWC Code 11-4-2(D)].
- 11. Fire Protection: The size of buildings shall be compared to the available fire flows in the area in order to establish whether or not fire sprinklers will be required, as determined by the Fire Chief.
- 12. Inspection and Release of Escrow Funds, The City shall inspect improvements throughout construction. The Developer shall be responsible to pay professional fees incurred for inspections. The City shall notify Escrow's agent in writing as to the installation of the improvement and the amount to be released. Escrow is entitled to release funds from this account only after receiving written notification from the City.
- 13. Conditional Acceptance: Notwithstanding the fact that the land on which the improvements will be located is dedicated at the time of the recording of a plat, the city shall not be responsible for the improvements, their construction, and/or maintenance until after a minimum one year guarantee period has expired and there is an official acceptance of the dedicated property and improvements by the city.
- 14. Professional Fees: Prior to recordation of the final plat, the developer will be required to pay all professional fees in full.



Good Morning Tom,

We noticed that in #5 of the proposed Mutual Aid Agreement between the District and South Weber that it referenced a "dual dispatch" of both Davis County and Weber County Units rather that South Weber City and Weber Fire District. In the amended Agreement attached, we amended it to reflect the response of only our departments, since the agreement is only between us.

Since the "dual dispatch" will include Layton Fire, Ogden Fire, South Ogden Fire, Weber Fire, State Patrol, Davis County Sheriff, and Weber County Sheriff, we believe it would be better to separate fire, EMS, and law enforcement into separate agreements. This would keep each agreement simple and specific to the needs of the agreement. One including all agencies and the specifics of the nature of response will be more difficult to complete as well as assuring that all agree to its content, and obtaining the approval of all agencies involved. We hope that our Mutual Aid Agreement for Fire will be effective and long standing and being a separate agreement, it will not be subject to the potential effect of future changes or termination by the other agencies.

Amendment:

5. It has been mutually agreed that for calls along the I-84 corridor from the Morgan/Weber County line to the Davis/Weber County line (just west of Adams Avenue Parkway), that the receiving dispatch center will "dual dispatch" both South Weber City and Weber Fire District units. The first arriving unit will assume command and determine both the jurisdiction and need for responding units. The governmental entity(ies) having jurisdiction will respond as requested, or may discontinue response based on on-scene resources and/or input from the on-scene Incident Commander. This may also allow us to proceed in a faster pace.

Let us know if you have any recommended changes and updates on the Agreements progress.

Mutual Aid Fire Protection Agreement

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of entering into a mutual agreement for fire protection and fire related emergencies that will be beneficial to all parties; and

WHEREAS, the undersigned are entering this Agreement pursuant to the, Utah Code Annotated 11-13-1, et set., Utah Code Annotated 11-7-1, et seq., 1953, as amended, to provide a joint mutual agreement relating to the mutual response and use of fire fighting equipment and personnel to fight structure fires and fire-service-related emergencies; however, excludes emergencies which require the use hazardous material equipment or personnel both within and outside the normal geographical jurisdictional limits of each party hereto, unless the requesting department's governing body has enacted a cost recovery ordinance.

WHEREAS, each party desires to cooperate with and assist the other in times of emergency or disaster;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED:

- 1. The area to be served by this Agreement shall be within the Weber Fire District, station 64 primary response areas, which represent unincorporated areas of Weber County, and the incorporated area of South Weber City.
- 2. The Fire Department of each party agrees to respond to structure fires and fire-service-related emergencies within the geographical area of a requesting party to this Agreement with equipment and manpower based upon need as determined by the requesting party's Incident Commander and as equipment and personnel are available as determined by the senior officer on duty for the responding party.
- 3. With the exception of the area described in paragraph 5 of this Agreement, the dispatcher shall dispatch the Fire Department from the jurisdiction where the incident is located first, and then, upon determination of need by the incident commander, a request for assistance may be made to the other participating Fire Department to assist in the incident.
- 4. With the exception of the area described in paragraph 5 of this Agreement, only upon determination by the requesting department that an incident is of such a nature that additional resources are needed, and then only upon the request of the incident commander of the jurisdiction where the incident occurs, will departments be dispatched to respond as provided herein. Self-dispatching of resources by participating Fire Departments of this agreement without the official request of the incident commander of the responsible jurisdiction is not acceptable.
- 5. It has been mutually agreed that for calls along the I-84 corridor from the Morgan/Weber County line to the Davis/Weber County line (just west of Adams Avenue Parkway), that the receiving dispatch center will "dual dispatch" both South Weber City and Weber Fire District units. The first arriving unit will assume command and determine both the jurisdiction and need for responding units. The governmental entity(ies) having jurisdiction will respond as requested, or may discontinue response based on on-scene resources and/or input from the on-scene Incident Commander.
- 6. Response under this Agreement shall be made only when the absence of fire personnel and/or equipment will not jeopardize the fire protection of the governmental entity furnishing assistance to another jurisdiction.

- 7. The dispatcher shall be requested to specify the location and directions, when necessary, where the fire department equipment and personnel are to be dispatched; however, the amount and type of equipment and number of personnel to be furnished shall be finally determined by the responding organization.
- 8. The first arriving officer shall assume command and may retain command at the discretion the next arriving superior officer of the jurisdiction where the incident has occurred.
- 9. The responding organization shall report to the Incident Commander in charge at the location to which the fire equipment and personnel are dispatched and shall be subject to the orders of that officer.
- 10. Parties to this agreement shall adopt and practice safety procedures in the interest of fire fighter safety.
- 11. Parties to this agreement shall assure that radio communications are established, programmed and functional for primary operational channels as identified and mutually agreed upon for responding to incidents within the other party's jurisdictional response area.
- 12. Responding equipment and personnel shall be released by the Incident Commander when the services of the responding organization are no longer required, or when the responding organization is needed within the area for which it normally provides fire protection.
- 13. Each party shall indemnify, defend, and hold all other parties, their officers, agents, and employees harmless from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs, expenses, penalties, damages, losses and liens, including without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees, arising out of or any way related to any act, omission or event occurring as a consequence of performing under this Agreement; provided, however, that each party shall be responsible for its own negligent acts and agrees to indemnify and hold every other party harmless there from.
- 14. The effect of the death or injury of any firefighter who is killed or injured outside the territorial limits of the governmental entity where he or she is a member of the firefighting department and while that department is functioning pursuant to this Agreement shall be the same as if he or she were killed or injured while that department was functioning within its own territorial limits; and such death or injury shall be considered to be in the line of duty.
- 15. Each party to this Agreement shall be responsible for workman's compensation and other benefits accruing to the members of their own department and such other employee-related matters, including insurance, as would normally occur for their own department.
- 16. No party to this Agreement shall be reimbursed by any other party to this Agreement for any direct expenses or direct losses incurred as a result of providing fire department services within another party's jurisdiction under the terms of this Agreement, except as otherwise provided and funded through cost recovery ordinances, or funding made available to the requesting Fire Department through state or federal resources. However, a party to this Agreement, at its option, may file a claim with the United States for the amount of its direct expenses and direct losses, incurred by fire department services rendered as a result of fighting a fire or fires on property of the United States, under authority of 15 USC 2210.
- 17. There is no separate legal entity created by this Agreement to carry out its provisions; and to the extent that this Agreement requires administration other than as is set forth herein, it shall be administered by the governing bodies of the parties acting as a joint board. There shall be no real or personal property acquired jointly by the parties as a result of this Agreement.
- 18. This Agreement shall not relieve any party to this Agreement of any obligation or responsibility imposed upon a party to this Agreement by law, except that the performance of a

responding party may be offered in satisfaction of any such obligation or responsibility of the requesting party to the extent of actual and timely performance thereof by the responding party.

- 19. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date of execution by the last party hereto and shall continue for a period of five (5) Years. Any party may terminate its obligations hereunder without cause by providing thirty (30) days prior written notice to all the remaining parties. Such termination shall not modify the Agreement as between the remaining parties, except only to exclude the terminating party from the obligations created herein.
- 20. This Agreement, as a condition precedent to its entry into effect, shall be submitted to the authorized attorney of each governmental entity for approval as to form in accordance with the provision of Section 11-13-9, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended.
